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SWAT Club and the Community

This month the SWAT (Students Working Against Tobacco) Club took the opportunity to spread the anti-smoking message to the community. The Navarre Community Resource Fair was held at Navarre High School. Members with the club set up a table with the health department.

SpeakOut was created in conjunction Crimestoppers. Anonymous tips are provided online or P3 phone app.

WBMS holds a "scavenger hunt" every year to promote the program. Past years, Speakout magnets this year its lanyards for the students. Students that find the winning lanyards win a \$25 Amazon gift card which is donated by Crimestoppers. This year winners are 6th grade Vladimir Torres and 7th grade Alexavier Atkinson.

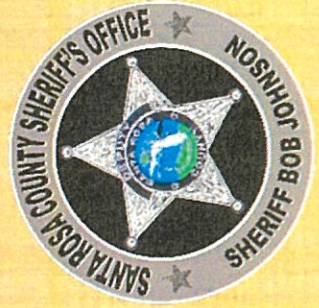


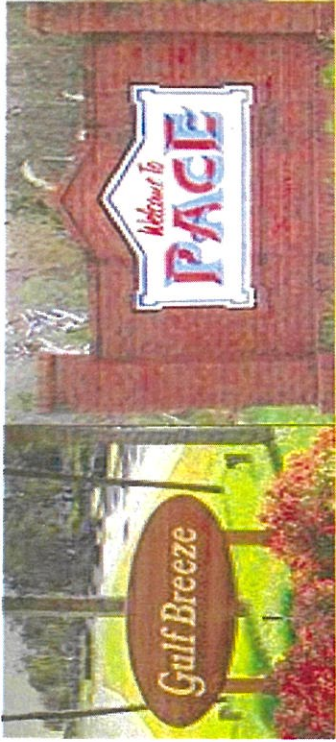

What is the SAFE Program?

The SAFE Program is a means for allowing better communication between Santa Rosa County Emergency Responders and residents with special needs, or other disabilities, regarding critical information before an emergency occurs.

How does it work?

When residents enroll in this program, our dispatchers will input critical information into our system. This information will then be shared securely with other First Responders in the county. Should an emergency arise, the Sheriff's Office, EMS, Police, and Fire will have all the information that was provided to better keep residents safe.

Who should enroll?

This program is for all Santa Rosa County residents with a disability or special needs.

Residents who might benefit from enrolling in the Safe Program

Include:

Individuals with

- Autism
- Down syndrome
- Alzheimer's disease
- Deafness
- Blindness
- Other communication disorders
- Other mental disabilities/limitations.

How to enroll

Visit the Sheriff's Office website. Under the programs section, residents can find the SAFE Program. After

downloading the form, email the completed form to Dispatch@SRSO.net

Please be sure to keep all information up to date.

After enrolling in the SAFE Program, residents may go to their local district office to

receive 3 program decals. These decals will serve as an identifier to First Responders. Decals should be placed on the driver side rear window and a home entry point.

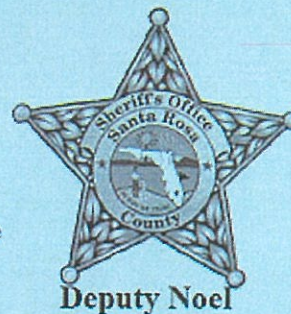
